# PURPOSE OF THE FOUNDATION

The Rollin M. Gerstacker Foundation was founded by Mrs. Eda U. Gerstacker in 1957, in memory of her husband. Its primary purpose is to carry on, indefinitely, financial aid to charities of all types supported by Mr. and Mrs. R. M. Gerstacker during their lifetimes. These charities are concentrated in the states of Michigan and Ohio.

#### President's Annual Letter

2021 was a significant year for Michigan and for the Rollin M. Gerstacker Foundation. We invested nearly \$9 million in a wide range of organizations in Midland and the region.

We were delighted to collaborate with the Elsa U. Pardee Foundation of Midland, jointly providing \$7 million to build the James T. and Elsa U. Pardee Cancer Center on the campus of MyMichigan Medical Center Midland. We are confident that this significant investment will elevate our fight against cancer and provide the highest quality of care for patients at MyMichigan. We treasure the opportunity to have made this donation at the request of the late Diane Postler-Slattery, whose idea for a major cancer center in Midland will become a reality.

Stronger families result in stronger communities. With this philosophy firmly in mind, we committed \$5 million to the rebuilding of the Greater Midland Community Center. The Community Center has been a hallmark in Midland for decades. And, the new facility with energized leadership, will provide activities for children, seniors and families for years to come.

The Midland Center for the Arts is celebrating 50 Years of creativity and discovery. Our \$5 million birthday gift is both a contribution and the Foundation's affirmation of the importance of art, culture, science and architecture in Midland.

The Foundation remains committed to working with the Midland Business Alliance's strategic efforts on flood reduction in Midland and Gladwin counties. We are very pleased to provide a grant of \$500,000 to The Nature Conservancy of Michigan focused on reducing soil sediment, erosion and nutrient run-off in the Tittabawassee River Watershed. We are thrilled by the strong and united efforts in Midland to repair the dams and reduce the severity and frequency of flooding in the area.

Investment in top-shelf health care has been a historical objective for the Foundation. Our commitment was evident once again with our grant of \$500,000 to support a Comprehensive Stroke Center and Interventional Stroke Program with Munson Hospital in Traverse City.

Sanford, Michigan, is the best little town by a (soon to be rebuilt, Hooray!) dam site. In the spirit of rebuilding Sanford, the Foundation continued our assistance to the Sanford Historical Society Founders Day Celebration.

We also continued our support of the Wildlife Recovery Association of Shepherd, Michigan. The Association visits schools taking along birds which they have nurtured back to health. We receive wonderful notes and pictures of the birds from participating students expressing their appreciation. Keep up the great work!

2022 marks the 65th Anniversary of the Rollin M. Gerstacker Foundation, a fitting celebration as our nation emerges from the grip of the pandemic. With the grit and determination of our Founders, we look forward with optimism and enthusiasm for Midland and our region's future.

As we reflect on the past year, we want to thank the many groups and organizations with whom we have the privilege to work. We also want to express our appreciation to our exceptional Trustees and superb staff. Another year of a "job well done." Thank you!
