

Its primary purpose is to carry on, indefinitely, financial aid to charities of all types supported by Mr. and Mrs. R. M. Gerstacker during their lifetimes. These charities are concentrated in the states of Michigan and Ohio.

2024 was both a significant and successful year for the Rollin M. Gerstacker Foundation. We are pleased to share that we made grants totaling \$9,085,920. Some grants were large and some were small, but we are confident that all our investments will make a positive impact in Midland and the mid-Michigan region. We wish to emphasize that we could not function without the active participation of our outstanding group of Trustees and our hardworking and dedicated staff. A wonderful team!

Yet, it is with heavy hearts we acknowledge that our beloved Trustee, Paul F. Oreffice, died in late December at the age of 97. Paul Oreffice and Carl Gerstacker were very close friends. Paul served on the Gerstacker Foundation's Board for nearly 50 years. He was a force in business as CEO and President of The Dow Chemical Company. Paul also was a leading voice for free enterprise across our nation. We will miss his counsel, common sense and wisdom. In honor of Paul and the Oreffice family, the Gerstacker Foundation made a contribution to Purdue University, Paul's alma mater.

Soccer, anyone? Paul Oreffice and the Gerstacker Foundation played significant roles in building the original soccer fields in Midland. Decades later, soccer leaders in our community are working hard to bring an indoor soccer and athletic training facility adjacent to the soccer complex. To encourage this grand idea, we have pledged a matching grant of \$1,500,000 as incentive to forge the financial commitment for more soccer in Midland; day or night, and rain, snow or shine!

The Gerstacker Foundation works very closely with the Midland Area Community Foundation (MACF). This past year we collaborated with the MACF in supporting a Clare-Gladwin Pre-School Scholarship Program and a Career Advancement Fund to help people complete their post-secondary education—either skilled trades or certifications. We hope to establish another doorway to opportunity in a complicated world.

Hope Township, in Midland County, is embarking on an effort to construct a new township hall and fire barn to serve this section of northwest Midland County and southern Gladwin County. The current structure is nearly 90 years old and needs some new life! We have made a \$300,000 matching grant to encourage additional contributions to this outstanding project.

We always have an eye to the future. Consistent with this philosophy, at our December board meeting, the Rollin M. Gerstacker Foundation elected two new Trustees to our Board. Amanda Bouwman, granddaughter of Gail Lanphear and niece of Laurie Bouwman, and J. W. Fisher have joined the Foundation. Amanda Bouwman hails from the Owosso area and is very engaged in her community and works in the social services sector. J.W. Fisher is a leading citizen in Midland, active philanthropist and President of Fisher Companies, a diverse construction, road-building and contracting company. We welcome them to our organization.

We look forward to 2025 and the challenges ahead with high aspirations. We maintain our positive commitment to Midland and the mid-Michigan region and the mission of our Founders.
